The New Hampshire Furniture Masters Association to Hold Annual Fundraiser at the Currier Museum of Art

CONCORD, NH – The New Hampshire Furniture Masters return to the Currier Museum of Art for *Masters' Pieces – The Main Event* on Saturday, September 22nd from 5:30 – 9pm. This is an evening dedicated to showcasing the exceptional talent of the Furniture Masters and the work that the organization does to educate and preserve the tradition of fine furniture making. The Currier Museum of Art is located at 150 Ash Street in Manchester, NH.

At the *Main Event*, meet and mingle with the Masters, view their remarkable fine furniture and bid on select work during a silent auction. Each participating Master donates a handcrafted item to be bid on during the event. This year's silent auction includes a contemporary end table that was made by Furniture Masters Tom McLaughlin and David Lamb during the latest season of *Rough Cut with Fine Woodworking*. Donations from Rare Woods USA and Lie-Nielsen Toolworks will also be available to bid on.

In addition to seeing fine furniture made by members of the Furniture Masters, attendees will also see select work by participants in the Furniture Masters' Prison Outreach Programs

in both Maine and New Hampshire and a table made by Dean Babin, the 2018 recipient of the Alden Artisan Advancement, a scholarship offered by the Furniture Masters for emerging young makers.

A People's Choice Award will be awarded to one of six New Hampshire Institute of Art students who will have their own work on display as a result of a summer mentorship program with a

Furniture Master. The students spent the summer visiting a Master's workshop and learning about fine furniture making. They have since reflected and created a response piece in their own medium which will be unveiled on the night of the *Main Event*. Participating NHIA students include: Abba Cudney, Kendal Ames, Jesus Carmona, Daniel Espinoza, Jason Correia and Derek Taylor.

A ticket to *Masters' Pieces – The Main Event* allows you to receive free admission to the Currier Museum of Art on September 22nd, 2018. With your admission, you can attend a Pecha-Kucha style presentation led by members of the Furniture Masters. The presentations take place at 11am and 2pm.
